**Meeting 2010
Hamburg 27. – 28.09.2010**

1. Discussion of Methods

- second reading of the **Method for the Determination of poisonous plants in roughage, IAG-Method A8**; third reading is scheduled for the meeting in Krefeld 2011
- third reading of **Determination of Rice chaffs (*Oryza sativa*) in Feedingstuff, IAG-Method A9**; last amendments and decision scheduled for the meeting in Krefeld 2011
- in Krefeld we shall inform all of the amendment regarding the wording "quantitative quantification" in the point "Objective and field of application" in all decided methods.

2. Conditions and future proceeding for IAG Ringtests:

After the decision of the conditions for "IAG ringtest Animals Protein" at our meeting last year in Hamburg and publishing on the IAG homepage, now we had the second reading of a draft "**General Conditions for IAG – Ringtests**".

At our meeting in autumn 2009 we discussed after approval of these general conditions to cancel the "IAG Ringtest Animals Protein" and to use general conditions as the only guideline. At our meeting in Krefeld 2011 a discussion will take place whether certificates for the participants of the ringtest should include the results.

3. Ringtest: amending our decision in Dublin all agreed that Mrs. Frick will carry out a ringtest for Ambrosia

4. Lectures:

Pascal Veys (EC-RL/AP) made a general overview of TSE Road Map 2:

EFSA will make a risk – assessment up to end of 2010 and based on it

- Revision of the list of SRM
- the age of ruminant

Revision of the feed ban based on the EFSA –risk-assessment

- the tolerance level of PAP for farmed animals
- lifting feed ban provision for non-ruminant, if methods are available and channaling PAP in feed-production, regarding to the economic efforts
- for a stop of cohort culling ante and post mortem tests are necessary
- EC-RL/AP stopped PAP – quantification and focused the work on ruminant targets now
